### TREASURER'S REPORT


FOR YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009


It is my pleasure to report the financial result from the **Waikato VHF Group's 46th year**. Our independently reviewed **Financial Statement (opposite)** summarises the Group's position at the end of our last financial year, alongside comparative figures from 2008 in the left margin. The major upgrade at our Kaimai site completed in February accounted for nearly half of last year's significantly increased expenditure. The Group also made donations of \$1000 to Kiwisat, plus \$500 to NZART to assist in offsetting Kordia site fees. Participation in August's Hamilton Market Day plus behind the scenes work by ZL1THG and ZL1UJG raised funds for our Trading Table.

A very generous donation received from Waihi Branch went a long way toward offsetting last year's costs. The Group also records its appreciation for support in 2009 from new and renewing **members**, and gratefully acknowledges **donations** totalling \$793 received from ZL's 1AMW, 1BXT, 1GEO, 1GWP, 1GZ, 1KIP, 1KL, 1KM, 1MOF, 1PK, 1TAJ, 1TPH, 1TWR, 1UJG, 3GR and 1FW, plus the Radio Electronics Group, and a profit share from Easter's Technology Conference.

2009's revenue from subscriptions increased 19% over 2008, and assisted in keeping our four beacons and seven repeaters on the air. Radio licensing costs have in the past accounted for about 50% of our annual operating expenditure, and saw a small increase last year as we began re-licensing our beacon's on new operating frequencies. Individual members may sponsor the annual re-licensing cost of a nominated beacon, repeater or link, and although this does not confer any special rights, their donation is acknowledged against that asset for that year. Maintenance and capital development costs are kept low by many hours of time donated (often at personal cost) by a few members plus our repeater trustees.

Unfortunately, access to some sites occupied by our assets is no longer as simple and inexpensive as it used to be. NZART, as head lessee on behalf of all branches, has been





engaged in protracted negotiations with one corporate site owner regarding proposed annual fees. Te Aroha will become un-affordable for our Group to operate repeaters there, and we face the prospect of having to abandon that site and establish an alternative multi-site system in an attempt to replace extensive coverage enjoyed from Te Aroha for 36 years. Your committee is working on plans to implement that strategy, and 2010 looks like being a challenging year financially.

Our quarterly **newsletters** are delivered to members via email in full colour PDF format wherever possible. If you're not receiving yours this way, it's probably because we don't have your email address. Details can be advised in the space provided on our membership application/update form, plus this helps us keep newsletter costs down. Except for two members who paid their 2010 subs last year, remember **subscriptions are now due**. Your committee proposes keeping our 2010 subs at last year's rates (Individual = \$20, Club or Family = \$25).

In closing, I wish to thank all members for your ongoing support, and look forward to your, and additional new member's, support in 2010.

## REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WAIKATO V H F GROUP INCORPORATED

I have reviewed the financial statements of the Waikato V H F Group Incorporated. The financial statements provide information about the past financial performance and financial position of Waikato V H F Group Incorporated as at 31 December 2009. This information is stated In accordance with the accounting policies set out separately.

### The Committees' Responsibilities
