Tauranga Repeaters Update

Tauranga 680

As of the 17th of February the Tauranga 680 repeater has been operating as an FM repeater. The D-Star service on this repeater has been permanently removed and re-established 70cm

Tauranga 3075 (New)

A new digital modes 70cm repeater has been established on Mt Minden near Tauranga and is co-located with the Tauranga 680 equipment. This is a D-Star repeater, but will also pass DMR & Fusion. The repeater currently does not have a tail but this may change in the future. The frequency is 433.075 with a +5Mhz Split (i.e. the input is 438.075). Power out is approximately 50 watts. The repeaters Internet linking hardware is almost ready and should be activated in a few days





WAIKATO VHF GROUP Inc. TREASURER'S REPORT FOR FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

Thanks to generosity of Waihi Branch 43 donating funds covering repair of a serious power supply fault at our Waihi North '5475 repeater, plus significant trading table revenue earned through efforts by Life Member Tom ZL1TOM / ZL1THG and Kevin ZL1UJG, along with fourteen members adding a donation or licence sponsorship to their subscription payment, our 2018 revenue lifted by \$3254. Expenditure also increased, mainly due to replacement equipment required for that repair at Waihi North costing \$1530 (53% of 2018 year's total expenditure). More than five days of trustee's time plus 500km of travel was donated towards repeater maintenance.

Just prior to Christmas 2018, our Te Uku '5675 repeater and its associated link to Te Weraiti was restored following recovery of that equipment by the NZ Police (allowing the donated repeater to be retained now as spare equipment). It had been anticipated the full **WaiPlenty network** could be restored during two full days worked at Te Uku, however after re-installing our equipment there, we discovered Maungakawa's link had ceased operation during last year. Maungakawa was visited in January 2019, and we found the circuit breaker supplying our link had been accidentally switched off, possibly while new equipment was being installed immediately above.

Radio licence fees, presently \$850 annually, are usually our largest single expenditure item. Radio Spectrum Management (RSM)'s budget to administer and support the amateur radio service is now recovered entirely from licensing fees levied on beacons, repeaters and inter-site links. A few amateurs remain under the impression that when licence fees ceased being charged to individual callsign holders in 2005, it became a "free" service. The majority of those fees are now levied on radio clubs and NZART branches operating those facilities, making it important individual operators support those organisations though membership and paying an annual subscription. The Waikato VHF Group Inc. is one such organisation, and beacons plus seven repeaters along with nine associated inter-site links operated by us to benefit amateur users throughout this region don't run on fresh air, they require our share of contribution to RSM's annual budget! It's pleasing to see an earlier trend of paid subscriptions falling away has reversed over this past three years. Long may that trend continue. Remember, our membership subscriptions fall due on 1 January



each year, and you must be a financial member to participate in voting at our AGM. Renewal details can be advised via our membership application/update form (available on our web site at www.ZL1IS.info). A Waikato VHF Group subscription remains very reasonable, so consider adding a donation or sponsoring one of our radio licences when renewing your sub? We gratefully acknowledge **donations received during 2018** from ZLs 1AAF, 1AI, 1AMW, 1GWP, 1KIP, 1KM, 1KP, 1KRH, 1PO, 1QW, 1REG, 3DM, 3GR/1FW, and 4GJ. Thank you all for your support.

Your committee carefully manages **expenditure**, minimised through considerable personal time donated by members and trustees. Repairs and maintenance costs spiked last year primarily as a result of restoring Waihi North's repeater service in early July.

Our independently reviewed **Financial Statement** (next page, followed by our reviewer's report) summarises the Waikato VHF Group's financial position at the end of F.Y. 2018.

REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WAIKATO VHF GROUP INCORPORATED

I have reviewed the financial statements of the Waikato VHF Group Incorporated. The financial statements provide information about the past financial performance and financial position of Waikato VHF Group Incorporated as at 31 December 2018. This information is stated in accordance with the accounting policies set out separately.

The Committee's Responsibilities

The Committee are responsible for the preparation of financial statements which fairly reflect the financial position of the Group as at 31 December 2018, and the results of it's operations for the year ended 31 December 2018.

My Responsibilities

It is my responsibility to express an independent opinion on the financial statements presented by the group, and report my opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion

A review includes examining, on a test basis, evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes assessing:

- The significant estimates and judgements made by the Group in the preparation of the financial statements, and
- Whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the group's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I conducted my review in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards in New Zealand. I planned and performed my review so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatements, whether caused by fraud or error. In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Unqualified Opinion

In my opinion the financial statements fairly reflect the financial position of the Group as at 31 December 2018.

My review was completed on 8 January 2019 and my unqualified opinion is expressed at that date.

Expedition 58 remains underway. {From Jonathan's Space Report}

On Jan 30 the Nanoracks NRCSD-15 cubesat package, launched on Dragon CRS-16, was attached to the MPEP platform. The next day the NRCSD-15/MPEP was pulled out of the Kibo airlock by the JEM RMS robot arm and its contents ejected into orbit over a period of six hours:

APL's CAT-1 and CAT-2 Cubesat Assessment and Test, two 3U cubesats with experimental signal processing payloads for an unidentified US Department of Defense organization; Aarhus University's 1U student cubesat Delphini 1, with a NanoEye Earth imager; The University of Southern Indiana's UNITE 1U student cubesat, with a Langmuir probe to measure ionospheric electron density; The San Jose State Univ/NASA-Ames TechEdSat-8, which will deploy a controllable drag brake to target reentry as part of an ongoing program to attempt recovery of cubesat payloads from orbit.

On Feb 7 the Slingshot deployer, launched aboard Dragon CRS-16, was mounted on the nose of Cygnus NG-10, currently berthed on the Unity node. Slingshot was developed by SEOPS LLC, now part of Hypergiant Galactic of Houston.

On Feb 8 at about 1345 UTC the Cygnus NG-10 (5.5. John Young) was unberthed from the Unity node and at 1616 UTC it was released into orbit. After departing ISS, the cargo ship SS John Young was in a 405 \times 418 km orbit slightly above the station. By 2130 UTC it had made two burns to raise orbit to 453 \times 460 km im preparation for cubesat deploys.

Cygnus/Slingshot deployed the Hypergiant Galactic/SEOPS Quantum Radar 1 and 2 cubesats at 0000:00 UTC on Feb 9. On Feb 13 at 1200 the Cygnus Nanoracks NRCSD-E deployer ejected Malaysia's MySat and NRL's CHEFSAT 2. CHEFSAT-2's mission is to space-qualify consumer-grade E-band (mm-wave) devices.

Later on Feb 13, Cygnus made a further series of burns to lower its orbit to only 293×306 km, below the ISS, and at 2245 UTC the NRCSD-E ejected KickSat-2, which contains over 100 small 5-gram Sprite chipsats. It is unclear when and if the Sprites will be ejected from Kicksat-2; the Kicksat-2 beacon has been detected but is very weak and it appears its antenna did not deploy correctly.
