WAIHI NORTH '5475 RESTORED

Further to our last newsletter, our Waihi North repeater was restored to service on 25 March using a substitute radio module. After the faulty module was brought back to Hamilton, it was repaired (RF Power Amplifier module was replaced) to become our spare.

NATIONAL SYSTEM KAIMAI ISSUES

Our Kaimai 434.850MHz repeater has presented several issues requiring site visits. The aging repeater equipment there has intermittently locked out (controller issue), and Trustee Neill ZL1TAJ made several visits to restore it before eventually replacing that repeater with a loan repeater on 1 April. However that developed a fault too, transmitting noise with the input signal buried in that (its receiver later being diagnosed as having a very noisy VCO.) Eventually, a second loan repeater was obtained, and installed on May 25th by ZL1TAT and ZL1UET, restoring linking between Rotorua, Taupo, Edgecumbe, Mercury Bay and Klondyke. Due to the extra DC load presented by this current loan repeater, the battery charger was upgraded from 3A to one capable of

delivering 8A.

While on site (in rather inclement weather), our 2400.260MHz ZL1VHW beacon was also checked, and the hut's south-west guy tightened.

HANDHELD RADIOS ON REPEATERS

At least one frequent user on our Waiplenty 2m repeater network has been observed using a handheld radio, frequently with marginal access. Each repeater in our network has 25W transmitter output, so a handheld radio's much lower powered Tx trying to access the repeater results in a significant power imbalance of at least one 'S' point below the repeater transmitter received by the handheld radio (which is likely to be fitted with an inefficient 'rubber ducky' aerial. That power imbalance becomes especially evident when the handheld radio is used inside a moving vehicle. Preferable to employ a properly installed radio with an external antenna while operating mobile.

Progress is being made to restore all facilities on this site. Branch 05 Christchurch report that electricity has been restored to their site, and new wooden poles installed awaiting rigging of antennas and feeders. Winter isn't the best time to be doing that site work, however expectations are rising to see the National System reconnected through Christchurch again.
