WaiPlenty Repeater network

Te Weraiti '695 has developed a buzz on its tail, likely caused by failure of the 5V plugpack used to sense presence of mains supply. Mains supply obviously remains on our battery charger, or that repeater would have shut down after a few days. Our equipment at Te Weraiti is suffering from hostile wet conditions inside the now unmaintained shelter it occupies. This fault has no impact on the repeater's performance other being annoying. Te Uku '5675 mysteriously lost its Tx modulation in June, although signals received via '5675 were still linked to other repeaters in the network. Tx modulation returned just before 29 August without any intervention from us – someone else working on site? All four WaiPlenty network repeaters were working and linked when recently monitored. IRLP remains operational across all our WaiPlenty network repeaters.

Kaimai National System '850 Repeater

Reliability of the National System relayed via Kaimai was fully restored after a loan repeater was installed there on 25th May. A permanent replacement repeater, displayed at our June general meeting in Te Aroha, will take up residence on site along with replacement batteries after ground conditions dry out later this year.

Kaimai links Klondyke with the National System north and south and Hamilton '9975, Rotorua '9925 and via Edgecumbe '9975 to Mercury Bay '4800. Taupo '9825 also linked via Kaimai, but appears to have a link Tx issue. Waitomo '9925 was linked via Kaimai, but that licence has been transferred to Mt Tuhua (N/E of Taumarunui) linking to Mt Egmont.

Tairua '6975 - end of an era

Originally established by the Waikato VHF Group in December 1983, this repeater has covered the eastern Coromandel peninsular from its Paul Road site for nearly 41 years. It was linked to Te Aroha '695 between 1987 and 1996, prior to responsibility for its operation and maintenance being transferred to Mercury Bay Branch 85 (currently in recess) during 2011, who linked it to their "Mercury Bay" '7075 repeater at Kakatarahae. Access to the Paul Road site has now been withdrawn, so the '6975 repeater and its associated link were removed from site on 27 August 2024.

Look after your Lithium Batteries

Lithium-Ion batteries offer high energy density, however must be treated with respect! Catastrophic fires can be the result when something goes wrong. Many fires are the result of battery abuse, including physical damage and improper charging, while others arise from internal failures due to manufacturing defects especially evident in counterfeit batteries. Dangers arising from inadequately packaged Lithium batteries is a major reason airlines, couriers and postal services won't accept them in freight. As " class 9

dangerous goods", special freighting arrangements are required, check with your intended freight company for guidance. Couriers specialising in transporting dangerous goods are available.

A presentation at a Fire Safety Conference in London by Professor Paul Christensen highlights challenges faced by first responders to fires involving Lithium-Ion batteries (Paul's 30-minute presentation commences at 1m00 minutes in this video. 


